STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to the Non-Liability of the State for
Damages.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No action shall be maintained against the state of Maine,
2 or any subdivision thereof by, and the state or any sub-
3 division thereof, shall not be held liable in any proceeding
4 in law or equity to, any person, firm or corporation for
5 damages or compensation for loss or damage to persons or
6 property, caused by the acts, negligence, or want of care
7 of any of its officials, agents, or employees, nor for any act
8 of any person committed by process of law to any state
9 institution, or paroled therefrom.
