STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Amending Section Thirty-three and Chapter One
Hundred Twenty-seven of the Revised Statutes of Maine,
Relating to the Disposal of Intoxicating Liquors Declared
Forfeited.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-three of chapter one hundred twenty-seven
2 of the revised statutes of Maine is hereby amended by in-
3 serting after the word "chapter" in the twenty-eighth line
4 thereof the words 'excepting cider,' and adding to said
5 section the following paragraph:

'All cider, declared forfeited by any court under this
2 chapter, which shall be found by chemical analysis fit for

3 use in the manufacture of vinegar which, shall by order
4 of the court rendering final judgment thereon, be turned
5 over to the sheriff of the county where such seizure was
6 made, by any officer competent to serve the process on
7 which they were forfeited, and he shall make return ac-
8 cording to said court; and said sheriff shall receipt to said
9 officer therefor. Said sheriffs may sell and dispose of such
10 cider to be used in the manufacture of vinegar and for no
11 other purpose. A record of such sales shall be kept by each
12 sheriff and he shall pay the proceeds from such sales into
13 the county treasury. Before delivering any cider under
14 any sale made in accordance with the provisions of this
15 section, the said sheriff shall take a bond, with sureties
16 residing in this state, and to be approved by the treasurer
17 of the county, from the purchaser of such cider in the
18 penal sum of double the amount of the value of such cider,
19 conditioned that all of said cider so received under such
20 sale, shall be used in the manufacture of vinegar and for
21 no other purpose.'
