STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to amend the Purpose of The Maine Institution for the Blind, and to Ratify the Acts of the Board of Directors thereof.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The purpose of The Maine Institution for the
2 Blind shall be amended by adding in the third line thereof
3 the words, 'and for such longer period as may be deemed
4 necessary by the Directors of said Institution,' and by
5 striking out the figures "57" in line eight and inserting in
6 place thereof the figures '62'; by adding after the word
7 "Statutes" the words 'and all amendments thereof,' so that
8 said purpose as amended shall read as follows:-

‘To establish, maintain and operate an Institution for the
 2 instruction of the blind and to provide a home for them dur-
 3 ing such period of instruction and for such longer period as
 4 may be deemed necessary by the Directors of said Institu-
 5 tion; to acquire hold and convey real and personal property
 6 necessary or incidental to said purposes and to possess all the
 7 privileges, rights, powers, and immunities conferred on
 8 educational institutions by Chapter 62 of the Revised
 9 Statutes and all amendments thereof.’

Section 2. All acts and things heretofore done by the
 2 Directors of said Institution in regular and legally called
 3 sessions of said Board, carrying out the purposes of its
 4 Charter as if it had always been as now amended, are hereby
 5 ratified and approved.
