STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Forty-one, Chapter One Hundred and Seventeen, Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and Sixty-seven, Public Laws of 1917; Chapter Two Hundred and Fourteen, Public Laws of 1919, and Chapter Two Hundred and Nineteen, Public Laws of 1921, Relating to Salaries of Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-one of chapter one hundred seventeen, of the
2 revised statutes as amended by chapter one hundred sixty-
3 seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen; by
4 chapter two hundred fourteen of the public laws of nine-
5 teen hundred nineteen, and by chapter two hundred nine-

6 teen of the public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-one, is
7 hereby further amended by inserting after the period fol-
8 lowing the word "laws" in the twenty-seventh line, the
9 words 'all actual and necessary expenses for travel and
10 hotel bills within their respective counties and,' so that
11 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 41. The sheriffs of the several counties shall re-
2 ceive annual salaries from the treasuries of the counties in
3 monthly payments paid on the last day of each month, as
4 follows:

Androscoggin, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Aroostook, two thousand dollars.

Cumberland, four thousand dollars.

Franklin, one thousand dollars.

Hancock, sixteen hundred dollars.

Kennebec, twenty-eight hundred dollars.

Knox, twelve hundred dollars.

Lincoln, eight hundred dollars.

Oxford, twelve hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-eight hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, one thousand dollars.

Sagadahoc, fifteen hundred dollars.

Somerset, fourteen hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, fourteen hundred dollars.

York, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Together with free rental of the house or living apart-

2 ment connected with the county jail in each county, in-
3 cluding the necessary light and fuel. Said salaries shall
4 be in full compensation for services in attendance upon the
5 supreme judicial court and upon the superior courts in the
6 counties of Cumberland and Kennebec as jailer, master or
7 keeper of the jail in each county, for receiving and com-
8 mitting prisoners therein and for the service of all criminal
9 processes and the performance of all duties relating to the
10 enforcement of all criminal laws. All actual and necessary
11 expenses for travel and hotel bills within their respective
12 counties and such necessary incidental expenses as are just
13 and proper incurred in the performance of their public
14 duties, including all necessary expenses for aid in keeping
15 the jails shall be allowed by the respective boards of county
16 commissioners of said counties and paid from the county
17 treasuries.'
