STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Twenty-four, Chapter One Hundred Twenty-eight, Revised Statutes, Relating to Conspiracies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-four of chapter one hundred twenty-eight

- 2 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after
- 3 the word "another" in the fourth line the following: 'or
- 4 for one or more of them to sell intoxicating liquor in this
- 5 state in violation of law to one or more of the others'; so
- 6 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 24. If two or more persons conspire and agree to-2 gether, with the fraudulent or malicious intent wrongfully 3 and wickedly to injure the person, character, business or 4 property of another; or for one or more of them to sell 5 intoxicating liquor in this state in violation of law to one 6 or more of the others; or to do any illegal act injurious 7 to the public trade, health, morals, police or administration 8 of public justice; or to commit a crime punishable by im-9 prisonment in the state prison, they are guilty of a con-10 spiracy, and every such offender, and every person con-11 victed of conspiracy at common law, shall be punished by 12 imprisonment for not more than three years, or by fine not 13 exceeding one thousand dollars.'
