STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for
the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated from
2 the state treasury to be expended under the direction of the
3 governor and council by the agent of the Penobscot tribe of
4 Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the year from
5 July first, nineteen hundred twenty-three to June thirtieth,
6 nineteen hundred twenty-four, and for the year from July
7 first, nineteen twenty-four to June thirtieth, nineteen hun-
8 dred twenty-five, as follows:

Amounting to twenty-seven thousand, and ten dollars and
 2 fifty-five cents, for the year from July first, nineteen hun-
 3 dred twenty-three to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and
 4 twenty-four, and twenty-five thousand, ten dollars and fifty-
 5 five cents for the year from July first, nineteen hundred
 6 twenty-four to June thirtieth, nineteen hundred twenty-five.

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of
 2 the sub-divisions above named and not required for the
 3 purpose may, upon recommendation of the state auditor,
 4 be transferred by the governor and council to pay bills
 5 against any of the above sub-divisions where bills may have
 6 been contracted in excess of the amount above set forth.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The amount asked for by this resolve is \$4,000.00 more than the amount recommended by the budget committee, but the amount called for by this resolve is necessary for the proper care of the Indians.
