STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT for the Better Protection of Smelts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-four, chapter forty-five of the revised

- 2 statutes as amended by public laws 1917; section seventy-
- 3 five, seventy-six and seventy-seven of said chapter are
- 4 hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the following be sub-
- 5 stituted:

'No smelts shall be taken or fished for in any waters of

- 2 the state between the first day of April and the first day
- 3 of October of each year except by hook and line. Anyone
- 4 violating any provision of this act shall be punished by a
- 5 fine of one hundred dollars for each offense.'

Nothing in this act shall apply to smelts taken in fish 2 weirs or traps maintained and operated for the catching of 3 sardines and herring.
