STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

---

AN ACT for the Better Protection of Clams in the Limits of the Town of Kennebunkport in the County of York.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No clams shall be taken from any flats within  
2 the limits of the town of Kennebunkport in the county of  
3 York, except with such written permit as the municipal  
4 officers of said town may issue, provided, that without such  
5 permit, any inhabitant within this state or any person  
6 temporarily resident within said town or the riparian owner  
7 of clam flats, therein, may take therefrom for the immediate  
8 consumption of himself or his family, within the limits of  
9 said town, not exceeding one bushel of clams at one tide.

Sect. 2. Any person taking shell fish contrary to the  
2 provisions of this act, shall be punished for each offense  
3 by a fine not exceeding ten dollars, or by imprisonment  
4 not exceeding thirty days, or by both.
