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**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE**

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AN ACT to Amend Chapter Two Hundred and Sixty, S. L.  
Nineteen Hundred and Eleven Relating to a Close Time on  
Lobsters in the Waters of Winter Harbor in Hancock County,  
by striking out all of said Act and inserting in place thereof  
the following:

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person or persons shall set any trap or other  
2 device used for catching lobsters between the first day of  
3 July and 9 A. M., Aug. 31st of each year, under a penalty  
4 of five dollars for each trap or other device set within the  
5 following described limits: In any of the waters of Winter  
6 Harbor in Hancock County inside of a direct line from  
7 Schoodic Island whistling buoy; thence northwest by west

8 to Egg Rock whistling buoy, and thence northeast by north  
9 to Jordan's Island bar.

Sect. 2. All fines and penalties provided for by this act  
2 may be recovered as provided by section forty-eight of chap-  
3 ter two hundred and eighty-five of the public laws of  
4 eighteen hundred and ninety-seven.
