STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of L. Mae Richmond, for Special and Extra Work for Aiding the Members of the Eighty-first Legislature.

Resolved: That there be paid to L. Mae Richmond, chief 2 clerk in the attorney general's office, the sum of one hun-3 dred dollars, for special and extra work in aiding the mem-4 bers in drafting bills, the same to be paid from the 5 appropriation for legislative expense.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Before the beginning of the present session of the legislature, the attorney general's office voluntarily offered to do the work of aiding the members of the legislature in drafting bills without an additional assistant attorney general such as is provided for by law and the expense of which for the past few sessions has been about \$1,000.00. In this work, Miss Richmond has aided materially and is the only one connected with the office for whom any extra compensation is asked. She has done her part of this work in addition to her other regular duties.
