STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a Commission to Investigate and Make Report to This Session of the Legislature Relative to the Construction of a Combination Railroad and Highway Bridge Over the Kennebec River and the Relative Merits of a Location for the Bridge Between the City of Bath and the Town of Woolwich, and a Location Between the Towns of Richmond and Dresden as a Site for Said Bridge.

Resolved: Section 1. That the governor, be and hereby 2 is, authorized and directed to appoint a commission con-3 sisting of five persons to investigate and make report rela-4 tive to the construction of a combination railroad and high-5 way bridge over the Kennebec river and the relative merics 6 of a location between the city of Bath and the town of

7 Woolwich, and a location between the towns of Richmond 8 and Dresden as a site for said bridge.

Sect. 2. Said commission shall make an estimate of the 2 cost of building the bridge at each of said places and of 3 the comparative cost of maintenance, and report to this 4 session of the legislature not later than the first day of 5 March next its findings, and also its recommendations rela-6 tive to the advisability of the state building a state bridge 7 across said river for the accommodation of railroad and 8 highway traffic and the most feasible location for said 9 bridge; and as to whether said bridge shall be toll or free 10 bridge.

Sect. 3. The members of the commission shall serve with-2 out compensation but shall be paid their actual expenses 3 from the funds available for the construction of trunk line 4 highways.

Sect. 4. Said commission shall not make, or cause to be 2 made, any survey or surveys of said river nor incur any 3 expense for engineering unless upon application to the gov-4 ernor and council, the latter to determine what surveys shall 5 be made, what expense for bridge engineers shall be incurred 6 and give directions regarding the same.
