STATE OF MAINE

IN "HE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Require the Teaching of the Constitution of the United States in Public and Private Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. In all public and private schools located within
2 the state of Maine, commencing with the school year next
3 ensuing after the passage of this act, there shall be given
4 regular courses of instruction in the constitution of the
5 United States.

Sect. 2. Such instruction in the constitution of the United 2 States shall begin not later than the opening of the eighth 3 grade, and shall continue in the high school course and in 4 courses in state colleges, universities and the educational

5 departments of state and municipal institutions to an extent6 to be determined by the commissioner of education.
