STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-four of Chapter Two Hun-
dred Eleven of the Public Laws, Relating to Registration of
Motor Vehicles of Non-residents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred eleven of the public laws of nine-
2 teen hundred twenty-one is hereby amended by striking out
3 the whole of section thirty-four in said chapter, and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the following; so that said section as
5 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 34. Non-residents may operate motor vehicles and
2 trailers except those hereinafter enumerated in this section,
3 on the ways in this state, without registration herein, pro-

4 vided such vehicles are registered in some other state or
5 country and have attached thereto registration plates, and
6 are driven by persons licensed to operate in this or some
7 other state or country. Provided, however, that no motor
8 truck, tractor or trailer used for commercial purposes and
9 owned either by a resident thereof, shall be operated over
10 any ways or bridges except and until such vehicle is regis-
11 tered and the registration fee paid as provided by statute
12 for the registration of vehicles with like capacity and char-
13 acter owned in this state; but registration and license evi-
14 denced by an appropriate plate or tag attached to the ve-
15 hicle may be issued to operate it for not exceeding five
16 days in any one year upon payment of one-fourth of the
17 fee required for annual registration of such vehicle; or,
18 for not exceeding ten days, upon payment of one-third of
19 such annual registration. A non-resident may at any time
20 apply for and obtain annual registration of such vehicle
21 by paying the difference between the fee for such short
22 term registration and the fee required for its annual regis-
23 tration. Such vehicle when registered as required by this
24 section may be operated by persons licensed to operate it
25 according to the laws of this or some other state or coun-
26 try, and may display their register plates in addition to the
27 plates of this state as required by this act.'
