#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Death Certificates of Physicians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixty-four is hereby amended by adding after

- 2 the word "dead" in the twelfth line of section twenty-one
- 3 thereof, the following: 'No physician shall issue any such
- 4 certificate of death unless he had been in actual attendance
- 5 upon such deceased during his last illness,' so that said sec-
- 6 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 21. A physician who has attended a person during

- 2 his last illness shall within twenty-four hours after the death
- 3 of said person make a certificate stating, to the best of his
- 4 knowledge and belief, the name of the deceased, his age,
- 5 the disease of which he died, and the date of his death,

6 and shall either deliver it to the person superintending the 7 burial or leave it with the family of the deceased or at the 8 said physician's office where it may be obtained when called 9 for; and a physician or midwife who has attended at the 10 birth of a child dying immediately thereafter, or at the 11 birth of a still-born child shall, when requested, forthwith 12 furnish for registration a certificate, stating to the best of 13 his knowledge and belief the fact that such child died after 14 birth or was born dead. No physician shall issue any such 15 certificate of death unless he had been in actual attendance 16 upon such deceased during his last illness. It shall be a 17 misdemeanor for any person to make a false return in 18 regard to any birth or death.'
