IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

---

AN ACT Relating to Hunting in Certain Specified Localities  
in the State of Maine.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-seven of chapter two hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen is hereby amended by striking out the words "situated in the town of Eden, in the county of Hancock: Bounded on the north and east by the Atlantic ocean, on the south by the highway leading from Hull's Cove bridge to the Beaver Dam bridge near Shea Brothers' farm, and on the west by the highway leading from said Beaver Dam bridge to Salisbury Cove; or" in the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh and

10 eighth lines of the first paragraph of said section, and by  
11 striking out the words "on said island or" in the second line  
12 of the second paragraph of said section, so that said sec-  
13 tion, as amended, shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 77. No person shall, except as herein provided, at  
2 any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal  
3 or any game or other wild bird within the following de-  
4 scribed territory: On Bartlett’s island in Hancock county;  
5 or on the one hundred and twelve acres of land, more or  
6 less, comprising Prout’s Neck, so-called, in the town of  
7 Scarboro, in the county of Cumberland; or on Richmond’s  
8 island, so-called, in the town of Cape Elizabeth, in said  
9 county of Cumberland; or on the tract of land comprising  
10 sixteen hundred acres, more or less, situated in said town  
11 of Cape Elizabeth, and bounded as follows: Southerly by  
12 the sea, westerly by the Spurwink river, northerly by the  
13 Spurwink road, so-called, leading from Spurwink bridge  
14 to Bowery Beach, easterly by a certain private road or way  
15 which runs in a southerly direction from the aforesaid Spur-  
16 wink road to said Bowery Beach, being the road which  
17 runs in front of the dwelling house of one Charles L. Jor-  
18 dan and along the easterly boundary of land of said Charles  
19 L. Jordan and along the westerly boundary of land of the  
20 Great Pond Club, but not including any portion of said  
21 Bowery Beach. It shall also be unlawful for any person  
22 to have in possession at any time any wild bird or wild  
23 animal, or part thereof, taken in violation of any provision  
24 of this section.

‘Provided, however, that the provisions of this section  
2 shall not prohibit any person residing within the limits of  
3 either of the above described reservations or preserves from  
4 shooting at or destroying any wild bird (except ruffed  
5 grouse or Hungarian partridge) or any wild animal, when  
6 found destroying his property; and provided, further, that  
7 the provisions of this section shall not be construed to pro-  
8 hibit the trapping of wild animals within the above de-  
9 scribed territory in accordance with the general laws of  
10 the state. Whoever violates any provision of this section  
11 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten, nor more  
12 than forty dollars and costs, for each offense.’
