STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Certain Ponds in Somerset
County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish in Coburn pond or in
3 Daymond pond in Moose River plantation; or in Cold
4 Stream pond or in Long pond in Cold Stream township
5 and in Parlin pond township, so called; or in Gander Brook
6 pond or in Ronco pond, or in Smith pond or in Burnt Land
7 pond in Dennistown plantation; or in Campbell pond situ-
8 ated on Kelly Gore, so called; or in Cape Horn pond in
9 Prentiss township, all of which waters are in the county

10 of Somerset, after June first of each year, except it shall
11 be lawful to fish in said waters, as provided by the general
12 law of the state, during open season provided by the gen-
13 eral law after said June first of each year, in the ordinary
14 way of angling with unbaited artificial flies or fly fishing,
15 so called.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in pos-
2 session at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of
3 any provision of these regulations.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and an addi-
4 tional penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught,
5 killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of
6 this act.

Section 3. Trial justices, police and municipal courts,
2 within their respective counties shall have, upon complaint,
3 original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judi-
4 cial court and superior courts in all prosecutions arising
5 under this act.

Sect. 4. All acts or parts of acts, or rules and regulations
2 of the department of inland fisheries and game, promul-
3 gated in accordance with law, inconsistent with the pro-
4 visions of this act are hereby repealed.
