AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in Bog Brook, So-called, in  
Oxford and Androscoggin Counties.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,  
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Bog brook,  
3 so-called, which brook is situated in the town of Hebron,  
4 in the county of Oxford, and in the town of Minot, in the  
5 county of Androscoggin, or in any of the tributaries to said  
6 brook except from the time the ice is out of said waters  
7 in the spring of each year until July first following, during  
8 which open season on said waters it shall be lawful to fish  
9 therein in accordance with the general law of the state.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and one dollar additional for each fish taken, caught or killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial justices, police and municipal courts within their counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts.
