STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Police Regulations at Stations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section nine, chapter fifty-seven, of the revised statutes of
2 Maine, revision of nineteen hundred and sixteen, now read3 ing: "No person shall loiter or remain, without right, within
4 any car, or station-house of a railroad corporation or steam5 boat, or upon the platform or grounds adjoining such sta6 tion, after being requested to leave the same by any rail7 road officer, or officer or agent of such steamboat. Who8 ever violates this section forfeits not less than two, nor
9 more than ten dollars, to be recovered on complaint," is
10 hereby stricken out and the following substituted therefor:

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11 'No person shall loiter or remain, without right, within any 12 car, or station-house of a railroad corporation or steam-13 boat, or upon the platform or grounds adjoining such sta-14 tion, after being requested to leave the same by any rail-15 road officer, or officer or agent of such steamboat, and no 16 driver or owner of any automobile or other vehicle shall 17 solicit passengers in any station or on the station grounds 18 or wharves of any railroad corporation or steamboat cor-19 poration without a written permit signed by an officer of 20 such corporation authorized to issue the same. Whoever 21 violates this section shall be punished by a fine of no: ex-22 ceeding one hundred dollars.'
