STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Teachers' Pensions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter sixteen of the revised statutes is here-
2 by amended by striking out in the sixth and seventh lines
3 of section one hundred seventy thereof, the words "two
4 hundred dollars" and inserting in place thereof the words
5 'two hundred fifty dollars,' so that said section as amended
6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 170. Any person of either sex who, on the thirtieth
2 day of September, nineteen hundred thirteen, or thereafter,
3 shall have reached the age of sixty years and who for thirty
4 years shall have been engaged in teaching as his principal

5 occupation and who shall have in all other respects met
6 the requirements of the preceding section shall, on his
7 formal application, receive from the state for the remain-
8 der of his life an annual pension of two hundred fifty dol-
9 lars.'

Sect. 2. Said chapter is further amended by striking out
2 in the seventh line of section one hundred seventy-one there-
3 of, the words "one hundred and fifty dollars," and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the words 'two hundred dollars,' so
5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 171. Any person of either sex who, on the thir-
2 tieth day of September, nineteen hundred thirteen, or there-
3 after, shall have reached the age of sixty years and who
4 for twenty-five years shall have been engaged in teaching
5 as his principal occupation, and who shall have in all other
6 respects met the requirements of section one hundred sixty-
7 nine shall, on his formal application, receive from the state
8 for the remainder of his life an annual pension of two hun-
9 dred dollars.'
