STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Limitation of Right to Enter on or Take Land.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

That section twenty-nine, chapter fifty-six of the revised

- 2 statutes of Maine, revision of nineteen hundred and six-
- 3 teen, is hereby amended by striking out the word "dwelling-
- 4 houses," substituting a comma for the period after the
- 5 words "burying-grounds," and adding the words 'but no
- 6 dwelling-house shall be taken unless the public utilities com-
- 7 mission, after hearing and view of the premises as provided
- 8 in section twenty-six of this chapter, shall find that such
- 9 taking is reasonably necessary in the safe and proper oper-

10 ation of the railroad in the public interest.' So that, as
11 amended, said section shall read as follows:

'The land taken shall not be entered upon, except to make 2 surveys, before the location has been filed, and the dam-3 ages estimated and secured as hereinafter provided; and 4 no railroad corporation shall take, without consent of the 5 owners, meeting-houses, or public or private burying-6 grounds, but no dwelling-house shall be taken unless the 7 public utilities commission, after hearing and view of the 8 premises as provided in section twenty-six of this chapter, 9 shall find that such taking is reasonably necessary in the 10 safe and proper operation of the railroad in the public 11 interest.'
