IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE Authorizing the Treasurer and County Commissioners of York County to Procure a Loan and Issue Bonds of Said County Therefor for the Purpose of Providing Suitable Quarters for Such Terms of the Supreme Judicial Court and Probate Court as Are Holden at Saco.

Resolved: That the treasurer of the county of York be
2 authorized to procure by loan on the faith and responsi-
3 bility of said county of York, a sum not exceeding fifty
4 thousand dollars, to be expended for the purpose of pro-
5 viding suitable housing and accommodation or such terms
6 of the supreme judicial court and the probate court as are
7 holden, or may hereafter be holden in said Saco, such sum

8 of money to be expended under the direction of the board
9 of county commissioners and a committee of three of its
10 members, chosen by the York County Bar Association.
11 And the treasurer is hereby authorized to issue bonds of
12 said county, with interest coupons attached to the amount
13 of said loan, said bonds to bear interest, payable semi-
14 annually at a rate not exceeding four per centum per an-
15 num, the principal to be payable at such times, not later
16 than twenty years from the date thereof as the county com-
17 missioners of York county may fix, said bonds to be signed
18 by the treasurer and countersigned by the county com-
19 missioners of said county, and said bonds not to be of larger
20 denominations than five hundred dollars each.
