STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Formation of Unions for the Employ-
ment of Superintendents of Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter sixteen of the revised statutes as amended by
2 chapter one hundred eighty-eight of the public laws of
3 nineteen hundred seventeen is further amended by adding
4 in section four, after the word "schools" in the second line
5 thereof of paragraph two, the following: 'or which has a
6 population of over four thousand inhabitants, according to
7 the last census,' so that said paragraph, as amended, shall
8 read as follows:

'II. The superintending school committee of a city or

2 town having under its care and custody an aggregate of
3 more than fifty schools, or which has a population of over
4 four thousand inhabitants, according to the last census, may
5 employ a superintendent of schools without uniting with
6 other cities or towns for the purpose. Said superintend-
7 ent of schools shall be chosen in the same manner and for
8 the same term and may be discharged under the same con-
9 ditions as superintendents employed under the provisions
10 of section fifty-six. Annually, in the month of December
11 the chairman and secretary of said committee shall certify
12 to the state superintendent of public schools, upon forms
13 prescribed by him, all facts relative to the employment of
14 a superintendent including the amount of his salary re-
15 ceived, then upon the approval of said certificate by the
16 state superintendent of public schools and presentation to
17 the governor and council, a warrant shall be drawn upon
18 the treasurer of state for the payment to the treasurer of
19 that town or city, of a sum equal to two-thirds the amount
20 expended by said town or city for said superintendence,
21 provided that the amount so paid for the benefit of a single
22 town or city shall not be at a rate exceeding eight hundred
23 dollars for one year.'
