## STATE OF MAINE

IN "HE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Penalties Under Motor Vehicle Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-one of chapter two hundred and eleven, pub-

- 2 lic laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, as amended
- 3 by public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is
- 4 hereby further amended by adding to said section the fol-
- 5 lowing: 'Provided that in every case which shall hereafter
- 6 result in a conviction for manslaughter due to the gross
- 7 negligence of the person operating a motor vehicle, the court
- 8 shall order the suspension of a license for such operator
- 9 for not less than ten nor more than fifty years,' so that said
- 10 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 41. Every court and trial justice in every case

wherein a person is convicted of the violation of any stat
ute relative to motor vehicles or to the operation of any

vehicle shall forthwith transmit to the commission an ab
stract, duly certified, setting forth therein the names of the

parties, the nature of the offense, the date of hearing, the

plea, the judgment and the result; and they shall be open

to public inspection during reasonable hours. Said magis
trates may make such recommendations to the commission

as to suspension or revocation of licenses and certificates

registration of respondents as they deem to be in fur
therance of justice; provided that in every case which shall

hereafter result in a conviction for manslaughter due to the

gross negligence of the person operating a motor vehicle,

the court shall order the suspension of a license for such

operator for not less than ten nor more than fifty years.
