STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Establish Close Time on Lobsters West of Petit
Manan Point.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter seventy-five of the private and special laws of
2 nineteen hundred and twenty-three is hereby amended by
3 striking out all of section chapter, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following:

'Section 1. No person or persons shall set any traps or
2 other device used for catching lobsters between the first day
3 of July, and nine o'clock in the forenoon of August thirty-
4 first of each year, under penalty of five dollars for each
5 trap, or other device set within the following described lim-
6 its: Beginning at Bear Cove, on the western side of Petit

- 7 Manan point, thence in a straight line to Little Black Ledge;
- 8 thence in a straight line in a southwesterly direction to
- 9 Schoodic Island whistling buoy.'
