IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Regulate Fishing in the Portion of Moose River  
Above Brassua Lake, in the County of Somerset.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for  
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish in that portion of Moose  
3 river above Brassua lake, in the county of Somerset, after  
4 the fifteenth day of August of each year except in the ordi-  
5 nary way of casting with unbaited artificial flies, or fly  
6 fishing, so-called.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in posses-  
2 sion at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any  
3 provision of this section.

The provisions of this section shall not be construed as  
2 applying to Long pond, so-called, or Wood pond, so-called,  
3 or Attean pond, so-called.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more  
3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further  
4 penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or  
5 had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, trial  
2 justices, police and municipal courts within their counties  
3 shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdic-  
4 tion with the supreme judicial court and superior courts.
