STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Relief of Poor Debtors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter one hundred and fifteen of the
2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding after the
3 word "imprisoned" in the second line, the words 'and any
4 person arrested or imprisoned on an original writ or process
5 that runs against the body of the defendant, and who is
6 unable to procure the bail provided in chapter ninety,' so that
7 said section, as amended, shall read:

'Sect. 3. A debtor arrested or imprisoned, and any person
2 arrested or imprisoned on an original writ or process that
3 runs against the body of the defendant, and who is unable

4 to procure the bail provided in chapter ninety, on request
5 to the officer or jailer who has him in custody, may be taken
6 before two disinterested justices of the peace, to be selected
7 as provided in section sixty-seven, to disclose the actual
8 state of his affairs.'
