STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Brook Emptying into Thompson Lake at Oxford, Known in Oxford and Otisfield as Greely Brook, and in the Town of Norway as Lombard Brook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. For a period of five years, it shall be unlawful
2 for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill, any kind of
3 fish at any time in the brook emptying into Thompson Lake
4 at Oxford, known in Oxford and Otisfield as Greely Brook,
5 and in the Town of Norway as Lombard Brook, in either of
6 said towns, in Cumberland and Oxford counties.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in posses-

2 sion, at any time, any kind of fish taken in violation of any3 provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than
3 thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and an additional
4 penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or
5 had in possession, in violation of any provision of this act.
Sect. 3. Trial Justices, Police and Municipal Courts, with2 in their respective counties shall have, upon complaint, origi3 nal and concurrent jurisdiction with the Supreme Judicial

4 Court and Superior Courts in all prosecutions arising under 5 this act.
