STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relative to the Parole of Women Committed to the
Reformatory for Women.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

No person committed to the reformatory for women other
2 than a person who was a bona fide resident of the town
3 of Skowhegan at the time of her commitment to said insti-
4 tution, shall be paroled in such a manner, or on such con-
5 ditions, that, during said parole, she shall be allowed to
6 remain within the territorial limits of the town of Skow-
7 hegan, and no person committed to said institution shall be
8 allowed to leave the limits of the grounds of said institu-
9 tion, unless paroled therefrom, except she be accompanied
10 by a duly qualified officer of said reformatory for women.
