# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Provide for the Better Protection of Clams Within the Limits of the Town of Perry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Limited to Residents. It shall be unlawful for
2 any person not a resident of the town of Perry, in the
3 county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes
4 within the limits of said town.

Sect. 2. Non-residents may dig clams for bait or home 2 consumption; limit one bushel. Persons not residents of 3 the town of Perry may be permitted to dig for clams for 4 fish bait or home consumption within the limits of said 5 town; provided, however, that no person shall dig for pur6 poses mentioned in this section during any one day more 7 than one bushel of clams.

Sect. 3. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates the pro-2 visions of sections one and two of this act shall for each 3 offense be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five 4 dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days.
