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**STATE OF MAINE**

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

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AN ACT Relating to Electors in Unorganized Places.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter seven of the revised statutes is hereby amended  
2 by striking out all of section seventy-four thereof, and in-  
3 serting in place thereof, the following:

'Sect. 74. Electors living on islands adjacent to the main-  
2 land along the coast of the state and within the jurisdiction  
3 thereof, but not incorporated with any town, and all such  
4 electors living in other unorganized places may file with the  
5 municipal officers of any adjacent town a statement in  
6 writing, signed by them or by some one in their behalf, of  
7 their intent to vote therein and shall, in case such electors

8 would be liable to a poll tax if an actual resident of said  
9 town, accompany the same with the amount of the poll tax  
10 levied upon others in the same town, on or before the first  
11 day of June, in which case such electors who so qualify,  
12 may vote in such adjacent town in all elections for governor,  
13 senators, representatives and county officers, and also in all  
14 primary elections for candidates for such offices.'
