STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Prohibit Fishing in the Tributaries of Lake Anasagunticook, in Canton and Hartford, in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,
2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time, in any of
3 the tributaries to Lake Anasagunticook, which lake is situ-
4 ated in the town of Canton and in the town of Hartford,
5 in the county of Oxford, except it shall be lawful to take
6 smelts, eels and suckers in said tributaries in accordance
7 with the general laws of the state.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in posses-

2 sion, at any time, any kind of fish taken in violation of any
3 provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than
3 thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and an additional
4 penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or
5 had in possession, in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. Trial justices, police and municipal courts, within
2 their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, orig-
3 inal and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial
4 court and superior courts in all prosecutions arising under
5 this act.
