STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Stony Brook, in Newry and in Hanover, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for,

- 2 take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Stony
- 3 Brook, which waters are situated in Newry and in Han-
- 4 over, in the county of Oxford, except it shall be lawful to
- 5 fish in said brook on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of
- 6 each week in accordance with the general law of the state.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in posses-

- 2 sion at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any
- 3 provision of this act.

- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more 3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and an additional penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed 5 or had in possession, in violation of any provision of this 6 act.
- Sect. 3. Trial justices, police and municipal courts, within 2 their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, orig-3 inal and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial 4 court and superior courts in all prosecutions arising under 5 this act.
