STATE OF MAINE

---

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

---

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Clerk of Courts in Washington County.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of  
2 the revised statutes as amended by chapters twenty-one,  
3 one hundred and five, and one hundred and ninety-seven, of  
4 the public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-three is  
5 hereby amended by striking out the words "fourteen hun-  
6 dred an fifty" in the twentieth line thereof, and inserting  
7 in place thereof, the words 'sixteen hundred,' so that said  
8 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 40. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several

2 counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasuries  
3 of the counties in monthly payments, paid on the last day  
4 of each month as follows:

Androscoggin, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Aroostook, two thousand dollars.

Cumberland, twenty-eight hundred dollars, deputy clerk of  
2 courts, two thousand dollars.

Franklin, fifteen hundred dollars.

Hancock, twenty-one hundred dollars.

Kennebec, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Knox, fifteen hundred dollars.

Lincoln, twelve hundred dollars.

Oxford, eighteen hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, fourteen hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, twenty-one hundred dollars.

Somerset, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, sixteen hundred dollars.

York, twenty-five hundred dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation  
2 for the performance of all duties required of clerks, includ-  
3 ing those performed by them as clerks of the supreme ju-  
4 dicial court, superior and county commissioners' courts, or  
5 by clerks pro tempore employed by them, and the sum pro-  
6 vided for the clerk in Lincoln county shall be in full for  
7 all such services and also in full for services as clerk of

8 Lincoln municipal court, except as provided in section forty-  
9 five of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes. They  
10 shall account quarterly under oath to the county treasurer  
11 for all fees received by them or payable to them by virtue  
12 of the office except fees collected by them in naturalization  
13 proceedings under the act of congress of June twenty-ninth,  
14 nineteen hundred and six, as amended by the act of con-  
15 gress of June twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and ten, specify-  
16 ing the items, and shall pay the whole amount of the same  
17 to the treasurers of their respective counties quarterly, on  
18 the first days of January, April, July, and October of each  
19 year.’
