STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, for Teacher's Pension for Etta M. Patten.

Resolved: That there be paid to Etta M. Patten of Corinna,

- 2 a pension of one hundred fifty dollars per year, payable
- 3 quarterly, from the fund appropriated for teachers' pen-
- 4 sions, beginning January one, nineteen hundred and twenty-
- 5 five, and continuing during the remainder of her life.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This woman is sixty-five years of age and has taught twenty-six years in the public schools of Maine, her first school being in the town of Bethel in 1877, after which time she taught in Milo, Mechanic Falls, Vassalboro, Island Falls, New Harbor, Newport, Vinaihaven, Palmyra, St. Albans, Vanceboro, and in Corinna. She is now suffering from fallen arches and failing eyesight.
