STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Granville Baker
of Hampden.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Granville Baker of Hampden, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers'
4 pensions. Said pension shall begin January first, nineteen
5 hundred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise pro-
6 vided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Granville Baker served in Company A, State Guards, Maine Militia, during the Civil war, and has an honorable discharge from the service. He is about eighty years old and unable to do any work to support himself. He has no income and is living by charity. He cannot receive a government pension for the reason that he served less than ninety days.
