STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams in Steuben.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Limited to Residents. It shall be unlawful for
2 any person not a resident of the town of Steuben, in the
3 county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial pur-
4 poses within the limits of said town.

Sect. 2. Non-residents may dig clams for bait or home
2 consumption; limit one bushel. Persons not residents of
3 the town of Steuben may be permitted to dig for clams for
4 fish bait or home consumption within the limits of said town;
5 provided, however, that no person shall dig for purposes
6 mentioned in this section during any one day more than one
7 bushel of clams.

Sect. 3. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates the provisions of sections one and two of this act shall for each offense be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days.
