STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase of State Pension for Helen B. Hobart of Farmington.

Resolved: That the pension of eight dollars per month 2 granted to Helen B. Hobart of Farmington by chapter one 3 hundred and seven of the resolves of nineteen hundred and 4 thirteen, be and hereby is increased to twenty dollars per 5 month, beginning January first, nineteen hundred and 6 twenty-five, which payment shall be in lieu of any other 7 state pension now provided by law.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Helen B. Hobart was granted a pension in 1913 of eight dollars per month. She is now a lady over eighty years of age and is unable to do any work and has no property of any kind. She has a daughter living with her whom she has supported and cared for as she is an invalid, during the last few years. She must either have an increase of pension or resort to public charity.
