STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Police Regulations at Stations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section nine, chapter fifty-seven, of the revised statutes
2 of Maine, revision of nineteen hundred and sixteen, now
3 reading: "No person shall loiter or remain, without right,
4 within any car, or station-house of a railroad corporation
5 or steamboat, or upon the platform or grounds adjoining
6 such station, after being requested to leave the same by
7 any railroad officer, or officer or agent of such steamboat.
8 Whoever violates this section forfeits not less than two, nor
9 more than ten dollars, to be recovered on complaint," is

10 hereby stricken out and the following substituted therefor:

'No person shall loiter or remain, without right, within 2 any car, or station-house of a railroad corporation or steam-3 boat, or upon the platform or grounds adjoining such sta-4 tion, after being requested to leave the same by any rail-5 road officer, or officer or agent of such steamboat, and no 6 person or driver or owner of any automobile or other vehi-7 cle shall solicit passengers in any station or on the station 8 grounds or wharves of any railroad corporation or steam-9 boat corporation in competition with such railroad corpora-10 tion or steamboat corporation, without a written permit 11 signed by an officer of such corporation authorized to issue 12 the same. Whoever violates this section shall be punished 13 by a fine of not exceeding one hundred dollars.'
