STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Zebedee Cushman of Kennebunk for
an Increase of Pension.

Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of ten dol-
2 lars per months beginning January first, nineteen hundred
3 and twenty-five, and a like amount each succeeding month,
4 which payment shall be in lieu of any other state pension
5 now provided by law.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Cushman is eighty-seven years old, his wife is eighty-three. Was a soldier in the Civil war for three years. He is totally blind and his wife is also helpless, with no relatives to care for them, making it necessary for him to hire all help to care for them. Mr. Cushman is now receiving eight dollars per month from the state.
