STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Requiring Non-Residents to Employ Guides at All
Times While Hunting in the State of Maine During the
Months of May to November, Inclusive.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section sixty-three of chapter two hundred and nineteen of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, as
3 amended by chapter one hundred and ninety-six of the pub-
4 lic laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen and by chapter
5 one hundred and nineteen of the public laws of nineteen
6 hundred and twenty-three, is hereby amended by striking
7 out the words "in such unorganized territory" in the fifth
8 and sixth lines of said section, and by inserting in place

9 thereof the words 'anywhere in the state,' and by striking
10 out the words "in any unorganized territory," in the thir-
11 teenth line of said section, and by inserting in place thereof
12 the word 'anywhere,' so that said section, as amended, shall
13 read as follows:

'Sect. 63. Non-residents of the state shall not enter upon
2 any unorganized or unincorporated township of the state
3 and camp or kindle fires thereon while engaged in hunting
4 or fishing without being in charge of a registered guide,
5 during the months of May, June, July, August, September,
6 October and November, or engage in hunting anywhere in
7 the state during said months without being in charge of a
8 registered guide, and no registered guide shall, at the same
9 time, guide or be employed by more than five non-residents
10 in hunting. Any such non-resident who enters upon any
11 unorganized or unincorporated township of the state and
12 camps or kindles fires thereon, while engaged in hunting or
13 fishing, without being in charge of a registered guide, during
14 the months of May, June, July, August, September, October
15 and November, or hunts anywhere in the state during the
16 months above named without being in charge of a registered
17 guide, in violation of any provision herein contained, or any
18 guide who shall guide at the same time, or be employed by
19 at the same time, more than five non-residents in hunting,
20 shall pay a fine of forty dollars and costs for each offense.'
