STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Expectoration in Public Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section fifteen of chapter one hundred and thirty of the
2 revised statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen is hereby
3 amended by adding to said section the following sentence:
4 'Municipal and police courts and trial justices shall have
5 jurisdiction over all offenses prohibited by this section.' So
6 that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'EXPECTORATION IN PUBLIC PLACES

Sect. 15. SPITTING IN PUBLIC PLACES, PROHIB-2 ITED. No person shall expectorate or spit on any public 3 sidewalk, or public street crossing, or cross walk, or, ex-

4 cept in receptacles provided for the purpose, upon the floor 5 in any city or town hall, in any court-house or court-room, 6 in any factory, in any public library or museum, in any 7 church or theatre, in any lecture or music-hall, in any ferry-8 boat or steamboat, in any railroad-car, except a smoking-9 car, in any street or interurban railroad car, in any rail-10 road station, or waiting-room or any sidewalk or platform 11 connected therewith. Whoever violates this section shall 12 be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars. Mu-13 nicipal and police courts and trial justices shall have juris-14 diction over all offenses prohibited by this section.'
