STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Analysis of Water Used for Domestic
Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter nineteen of the revised statutes of nineteen hundred and sixteen is hereby amended by adding the following sections:

'Sect. 125. The state board of health may require any person selling or supplying water for domestic purposes to furnish samples thereof for chemical and bacteriological examination and if said water is found to be contaminated, polluted and unfit for domestic use, the state board of health may issue an order prohibiting the transporting, sale, dis-

7 tribution or supplying of such water as long as such con-
8 tamination, pollution and unfitness remains.

'Sect. 126. Whoever neglects or refuses to furnish such
2 samples of water, or violates or disobeys any order of said
3 state board of health, shall be punished by a fine of not
4 less than five nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprison-
5 ment for not less than ten nor more than thirty days.'
