#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Seven of Chapter Twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Guideposts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred seven of chapter twenty-four of the 2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the whole

3 of said section, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 107. It shall be the duty of the state highway

- 2 commission to cause to be erected and maintained, at all
- 3 crossings of highways, and where one public highway enters
- 4 another, substantial guide-posts not less than eight feet
- 5 high, and fasten to the upper end of each a board, on which

6 shall be plainly printed, in black letters on white ground, 7 the name of the next town on the route, and of such other 8 place as the municipal officers direct, with the number of 9 miles thereto, and a figure of a hand with the foreinger 10 pointing thereto. If erected on state or state aid highways, 11 such guide-posts and guide-boards shall be of such reason-12 able form, height and design as such state highway com-13 mission may direct. For the purpose of enabling the state 14 highway commission to carry out the provisions of this act 15 there is hereby appropriated the sum of two thousand dol-16 lars annually.'
