STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Collection of Fees by State Officers and Their Clerks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section ninety-six of chapter two of the revised statutes
2 is hereby amended by striking out in the fourth, fifth and
3 sixth lines of said section the following words: "No state
4 department, commission, board or institution shall be
5 charged for information or copies of records furnished by
6 another state department, commission, board or institution";
7 and by inserting in place thereof the words: 'The state nor
8 any of its departments, boards or commissions shall be

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9 charged for interest on deposits in the hands of the treasurer 10 of state, nor for information or copies of records furnished 11 by another state department, commission, board or institu-12 tion,' so that, as amended, said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 96. All state officers, their clerks or agents, who 2 furnish copies for information from any of the records of 3 the various state departments shall account to the state and 4 shall pay over to the treasurer of state all fees collected 5 therefor. The state nor any of its departments, boards or 6 commissions shall be charged for interest on deposits in the 7 hands of the treasurer of state, nor for information or 8 copies of records furnished by another state department, 9 commission, board or institution.'

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
