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RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert F. Parlin of Fayette, for State  
Pension.

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*Resolved:* That there be paid to Robert F. Parlin of Fayette, the sum of twenty-five dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' pensions, beginning January one, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Parli is a World War veteran, a native born citizen of Maine. He served in the Canadian Army overseas. He has tuberculosis and is unable to work. He has a wife and three children. The oldest child is four and the youngest, one. The wife is capable of earning her own living but her duties to her husband and children necessarily keep her with them. The American Legion at Livermore Falls has done its best to secure aid for him, but so far without success.
