STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Luke Woodard,
of Cornville.

Resolved: That a pension of twenty dollars per month be,
2 and hereby is, granted to Luke Woodard, of Cornville, to
3 be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers'
4 pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hun-
5 dred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise provided
6 by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Woodard is an honorably discharged soldier of the Civil War. He served less than ninety days and for that reason cannot receive a government pension. He is about seventy-five years of age, or possibly older. He is very feeble, has no income, and is supported by charity. He was a resident of Maine when he entered the service.
