STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Close Hunting in Certain Territory in Sagadahoc County, to be Known as the West Bath Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. For a period of six years from the time this 2 act becomes effective, no person shall at any time hunt, trap,

- 3 catch, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal, or bird,
- 4 (except bobcats, Canada lynx, foxes, rabbits, minks, skunks
- 5 or ducks) within the following described territory situated
- 6 in the town of West Bath in the county of Sagadahoc:
- 7 Beginning on the east bank of the New Meadows river at
- 8 a point due west of the northwest corner of the cottage
- o dwelling of Samuel R. Percy at Sabino, so called; thence

running easterly to the Sabino road; thence easterly by said
I Sabino road to Prince's Corner, so called; thence southerly
by the Campbell's Pond road and Brigham's Cove road to
Brigham's cove in Winnegance bay; thence southerly, westerly and northerly by the shore of said Winnegance bay
and said New Meadows river to the point of beginning.
The territory hereinabove described shall be known, and
in any proceedings under this act may be designated as the
West Bath Game Preserve. It shall also be unlawful for
any person to have in possession at any time within the
period aforesaid any wild animal, alive or dead, or any
wild bird taken or killed in violation of any provision of

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than 3 one hundred dollars and costs for each offense, or to im-4 prisonment for thirty days, or to both said fine and im-5 prisonment.
