STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes and Chapter One Hundred Thirty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Providing for Kindergartens as Part of the Common School Course.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
R. S., Chap. 16, Sec. 30; Chap. 134, 1917, Public Laws,
2 Relating to School Age and Providing for Kindergartens
3 as a Part of the Common School Course. Section thirty
4 of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes, as amended by
5 chapter one hundred thirty-four of the public laws of nine6 teen hundred and seventeen, is hereby amended further by

7 inserting after the word "training" in line twenty-three8 thereof the words, 'or an equivalent,' so that the section, as9 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 30. Kindergartens to be established when petitioned 2 for. Qualifications of teacher. The age of pupils allowed 3 to attend the public schools of the state is hereby fixed be-4 tween the ages of five and twenty-one years; and every 5 child between the said ages shall have the right to attend 6 the public schools in the town in which his parent or guar-7 dian has a legal residence, subject to such reasonable reg-8 ulations as to the numbers and qualifications of pupils to 9 be admitted to the respective schools and as to other school 10 matters as the superintending school committee shall from II time to time prescribe; provided, however, that the super-12 intending school committee of any city or town may, and 13 upon the filing with the municipal officers of such city or 14 town of a petition not less than one month before the an-15 nual town meeting by the parents or guardians of thirty 16 or more children between four and six years of age living 17 within a mile of a public elementary school, shall, unless 18 otherwise instructed by the town or city, maintain a kinder-19 garten or kindergartens as a part of the common school 20 course, and pupils shall be allowed to attend such a kinder-21 garten or kindergartens upon reaching the age of four years; 22 provided further, that unless the average daily attendance 23 in any kindergarten shall be fifteen or more for any school 24 year the superintending school committee, upon the recom-25 mendation of the superintendent of schools, may discontinue 26 the school; provided further, that no person shall be al-27 lowed to teach in any kindergarten maintained under the 28 provisions of this section who has not completed at least 29 a two years' course in kindergarten training or its equiva-30 lent and received a certificate or diploma from a recognized 31 kindergarten training school approved by the state super-32 intendent of public schools.'
