STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Alice Fuller, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month 2 be, and hereby is, granted to Alice Fuller, of Lewiston, to 3 be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for soldiers' 4 pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nineteen hun-5 dred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise provided 6 by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Alice Fuller is a widow about sixty-two years of age. She is the daughter of Patrick Curran, who served in Company I, 25th Regiment of Maine Infantry during the Civil War. Her son, who was her only support, served in the World War and has died since the close of the War leaving his mother in destitute circumstances. She is unable to support herself, because of poor health and advancing years.
