## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE. HUNDRED AND TWENTY-FIVE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Florence J. Judkins, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That a pension of twelve dollars per month 2 be, and hereby is, granted to Florence J. Judkins, of Lew-3 iston, to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for 4 soldiers' pensions. Said pension shall begin July first, nine-5 teen hundred and twenty-five, and continue until otherwise 6 provided by the legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Florence J. Judkins is a widow about sixty years of age. She is the daughter of Marshall S. Gray, who enlisted in the Civil War from the town of Cape Elizabeth, Maine, in the year 1861 in Company E, 12th Maine Regiment; he died in New Orleans on June 2, 1862 of disease. Mrs. Judkins is destitute and in poor health, and asks for aid on account of her father's service, as above.
